I harp on this a lot but it is so important and I thank our committee for their buy in and willingness to contribute to this. Socially, the traditional AFL Grand Final Day kicked the season off with a bang and other annual functions such as Ladies Lunch, Christmas Party and Reverse Raffle were also well supported by members, and in turn, highly profitable for the club. We introduced our 'Shark Park' match report and dinner nights which were well supported and helped integrate a number of junior players and family members who attended – Thanks to Michele Lockie, Pete Colosimo and the Southwards for their assistance on these nights.

Our social scene isn't what it was 10 years ago – but as we move with the times, and now cater towards families and children, there is no reason why being actively involved socially cannot be as fun and rewarding and importantly, all inclusive.

We continue to lead the way in community engagement – which is pivotal to our ongoing relationship with the local council and for our standing in the Bayswater community. This relationship and standing puts the club in a great position to have success with grant applications and puts us at the forefront of council when it comes to facility improvements – as well as allowing us to increase member numbers through community awareness.

The 'Cinema Under the Stars' program was a major success this year. The weather gods looked after us, providing perfect weather on three of the four nights giving us the perfect platform to show off our club. There were numerous volunteers who gave up their time to assist in CUTS but none more so than Ralph Wellington and Michael Finn who were the two main driving forces behind the initiative and its success.

BPCC Charity Day was an absolute highlight of the season – with over \$18,000 raised for both the National Breast Cancer Foundation and MS Research. After deciding to split with WSCC and run it as

a standalone event, the effort the committee put into this event was huge, with Mel Causer deserving special recognition for her dedication and efforts in putting the day together.

On Field, we returned to fielding five teams in our senior program, with the highlight being the 4<sup>th</sup> XI premiership led by Chris Gibson. I do need to apologise to the 4<sup>th</sup> XI for not putting enough emphasis on this at our senior presentation night. This is something that in the period of reflection mentioned above, I've realised and I do apologise.

Our 5<sup>th</sup> XI were brilliantly led by David Singleton, assisted by Dale Christy, and supported by Robin Court, Colin Southward and Peter Colosimo. Having these five experienced players allowed the rest of the team to be filled with junior players – something we haven't seen at BPCC in a number of years and something we should be proud of.

Whilst a disappointing year for our 1sts, 2nds and 3rds in terms of ladder position — We as a club need to judge 'success' differently as the club evolves and our age demographic changes. A lot of younger players were given opportunities this season, which is testament to the captains and coach Vozzo who deserve huge thanks for their time, effort and energy this year. Captaincy often goes without reward, but hopefully you all know how thankful the club is for your work. And to the coaching group of Damien Vozzo, Marcus Adams and David Singleton — you guys were fantastic. Damien, your work this year is appreciated and the fruits should be seen in the coming years — and whilst you have resigned (not sacked) from the position, we know you will be around, supporting newly appointed head coach Marcus Adams.

Ray Kazar again led the Vets side, and Sarah Smith the ladies team. The club are quite lucky in that these two run the entire show for these teams, which allows many of our great club people to have a day off on Sundays. Thanks to you both for ensuring that BPCC field these teams and we really appreciate the work you do.

Our junior program which is going from strength to strength has been a huge winner this year with three junior premierships which is a fantastic achievement. As I mentioned at junior presentation night, even more important is that Mel and the coaching group have created an environment that the kids enjoy and that parents are proud to have their kids enrolled in. This to me is success – regardless of winning or losing and it's been great to see so many kids wearing the blue sharks warm up tops up at GT.

The Milo program was also successful, and a successful grant application allowed us to cover a lot of the cost, as well as include more female participants. Thanks to Sir Robin Court (OBE/MBE) and Ian Barlow for running our Milo program.

Going forward we will be pushing hard to have 6 senior sides as well as increasing the number of junior teams and milo participants. With Bayswater becoming a relatively young area again, we firmly believe that the cycle is turning in our favour and that the junior success this season is only the tip of the iceberg.

Financially, the club has made a tidy profit, which we need to meet and beat next year. There are multiple reasons for our stronger financial position, but quite simply it is all of our members, players and families who contribute their hard earned money that has created our profitable position.

We are always looking at how we can create new revenue options and are constantly reviewing our costs. There are multiple examples where a short term expense may be required to create a long term financial benefit but we need to weigh these up and make strategic decisions. Operating costs are increasing year on year, and we don't want to have to always be dipping into our members

pockets so it's vital that we keep looking long term and increasing turnover and then spending smartly but weighing this up with the needs of our members and also improving our facilities.

Commercially we will continue to engage with sponsors and work out how our sporting club can build mutually beneficial relationships. We thank all of our amazing sponsors for their support in season 15/16 and look forward to future dealings.

All in all. this year was one of the most challenging but rewarding of my life. I love challenges and I love testing myself as a person and it's amazing how much you learn about yourself when you are in this position. There were certainly times I questioned myself, and times I've made mistakes — but mistakes are simply learning opportunities and as long as you are honest enough to admit fault then you will benefit in the long run.

I would personally like to thank so many people – but I'd go deep into page 3 if I was to do this properly as so many amazing people have contributed to our club, and personally helped me. Our committee are fantastic people who have a willingness to serve our club and community and I am blessed to work with you all and have your support. My wife Liz is very much a voice of reason, and can pull me into line when I start talking grand plans. No person can contribute the time required to be president, without their partners support. With Liz she doesn't just support, she gets on board and contributes and has been a great contributor to our club for many years now.
