## 1XI Report- James Court

After a disappointing 2018/2019 campaign, the BPC 1XI were hopeful of getting that winning feeling back in season 2019/2020 and the welcome additions of Drew McKenzie and Troy Gstrein had us believing anything was possible.

Unfortunately, the season could not have gotten off to a worse start with a nail biting round one loss away to Warranwood. A loss that pretty much summed up the mindsets between a side that expected to win from any position (Warranwood) and a team that had been relegated the season before after losing a number of close games (BPC).

Round two against Warrandyte shaped up to be a crunch game for where our season would head. Chasing 182 we were cruising to victory at 5-172. As has been the case for too long, we then imploded to be 9-173 still needing nine runs to win. Having lost so many of these games previously Jesse Christensen batting at nine and Peter Eagles stood up and delivered the much needed nine runs needed for victory.

Wins against bottom four teams Croydon Ranges, Kilsyth and Wonga Park followed and we had started to get that winning feeling back. We were now four wins and one loss (two wash outs) with one more game to be played before Christmas, which was to be away against bogey team Warranwood. Leading up to the game we knew this was going to be a big moment for the group as Warranwood have had the wood over us for so long. We knew that we needed to take a different mind-set into this game and prove to ourselves that we were a legitimate top four side. Unfortunately, this ended up being our most convincing loss for the year and we knew we still had a lot more work to do after Christmas.

Post-Christmas was greeted with a run of games against bottom four teams Warrandyte, Kilsyth and Croydon Ranges. All of these games ended in convincing wins and we were starting to play some really good cricket.

At this point of the season we were sitting on six wins and two losses (two wash outs) and were comfortably inside the top four. Question marks still lingered about our ability to compete against top four teams Norwood, Templeton and Warranwood.

Over the next two weeks we were faced with away games against top Norwood and Templeton. In hindsight this ended up being perfect preparation for the finals.

Being sent in against a strong Norwood bowling attack and losing early wickets we managed to hold our nerve and bat out our 80 overs to put a respectable 181 runs on the board. Unfortunately, rain interfered the next week but not before we had Norwood in trouble at 3-50. We were sent in to bat once again the following week against Templeton. On a slow ground we were able to put a competitive 164 runs on the board. As per the previous game against Norwood we lost early wickets but were able to hold our nerve to bat out 78 overs. Just like against Norwood the following week was heavily interrupted by rain but unlike the previous week the game ended with a result. (albeit a tie)

A final round win against Wonga Park saw us end the season in third place with eight wins, two losses, one draw and three wash outs. Our only losses of the season had been away against Warranwood and predictably they were our opponents for our first final. Unlike the earlier games during the season, this time we would play them at Shark Park where we were undefeated over the season.

Winning the toss and sending Warranwood into bat we knew we had a home ground advantage on a very lush Guy Turner Reserve. What followed would have to be one of the most convincing BPC 1XI finals victories in our 52-year history. Jordan Rutherford single handily annihilated a dangerous

Warranwood top order reducing them to 8-13. Some lusty hitting saw WCC end up being all out for 59. On a SLOW Shark Park there were a few nerves going into the run chase however any thoughts of a tight finish were torn to shreds with an undefeated 60 runs opening partnership. At 4.00 on the first day of an elimination final Warranwood conceded victory.

Our opponents for the preliminary final, Norwood, ended the home and away season on top, however, we were playing great cricket and we took great confidence into this final. On a lightning fast outfield, we knew that a change of tactics would be required. Winning the toss and batting, an 114 run opening partnership set up our total of 255. In response Norwood never looked like it and we dismissed them for 154.

We had saved our best cricket for the end of the season and were full of confidence. Bat for bowl first, we knew we could win from any position. We are a side that unlike some of our opponents were not relying on individuals. Like the mighty tigers of 2017 all the stars were aligning.

Unfortunately for all of us, what was to follow will take a long time to get over. The grand final against Templeton was called off and they, as the higher ranked team going into the GF, were awarded the premiership and ultimately promotion.

Who knows what will happen over the next few months but when cricket does return there is certainly unfinished business that I am sure we will be working hard to overcome.

On behalf of all of the boys who played this season, a massive thanks goes to Andrew Sharp for taking over the books at the start of the season. Also, a huge thanks to everyone who contributed for our afternoon teas; scones, sweet chilli chicken wraps, pulled pork burgers.....afternoon tea at Shark Park has come a long way! Thanks to my wife Melissa for putting up with me and being such a great wife and mum. Additionally, thanks to all of our families and our loyal club supporters for their support over the season.

### **3XI Report- Ryan Toye**

What a crazy season 2019/2020 was, winning a grand final without a ball being bowled, the captain breaking a nail and missing half the season, the team playing with four Fays in a game and having four captains throughout the year.

We had a great year only losing one game for the season. We had some outstanding performances during the season including Glenn Coyle and Tim Court making 100's, Eoin Fay taking bags of five wickets on four separate occasions and Chris Robbins and Jayden Mitchell also took a 5 f each as well.

We learnt pretty early in the season that we were a bowling team. Our plan for most games was to win the toss, bowl (I lost most of them, but we still bowled), Robbo to get an early break through and then bring on Eoin and Tommy to bowl out the innings. Tommy holding it up from one end while Eoin would take all the wickets from the other. It worked for us. Batsmen are dumb. Time and time again they would try and smash Eoin out of the park and time and time again he would get them out by using his brain and setting good fielding positions.

Eoin had an outstanding season taking 35 wickets at 6. That's just crazy numbers. Tommy's numbers were very good as well with 17 wickets at 12 and Robbo not far behind that with 14 wickets at 15. We didn't get to play the Grand Final due to some guy eating a bat, so we didn't know at the time that the Semi Final was actually our Grand Final. Day one I lost the toss again, but luckily for us they decided to bat. Jayden Mitchell and Chris Robbins took the new ball and once again Robbo got an early wicket, but after that it was all Jayden who was easily the best bowl for us; 19 overs, 10 maidens coming away with 5/29. He put on a clinic, just bowling outside off and not bowling a bad ball....the batsmen got themselves out.

After Jayden and Robbo were done, the ball was thrown to the Fays to continue doing what they had all season, bowl a lot of dot balls and get through their overs quickly. Eoin bowled well without much luck taking only one wicket, but he only went for 30 from his 21 overs. Tommy at the other end showed his finals experience. He didn't bowl any loose balls, the batsmen couldn't score and finally they'd play a bad shot and go out. Tommy finished with 3/21 off 15, a great bowling partnership by both Tommy and Eoin.

In the end we bowled them all out for 104. We had to bat seven overs on Day 1 and unfortunately it wasn't a good seven overs for us ending the day 2/7. It wasn't the end of the world though as we only needed 97 runs with 8 wickets in hand, it was very gettable.

Day two started off horribly, 3/11, 4/14, 5/30, 6/32. Normally that would be the curtains for us however we had Leigh Brown and Phil Leach at the crease, both who had played a lot of 2XI cricket and were experienced at batting under this kind of pressure. With these two at the crease I was still confident. They knew the longer we kept them out there the better our chances of winning became; they were getting tired and scoring became easier. Brownie was the seven wickets to fall at 60. Eoin was the next one in, he played his attacking game, put the bad ball to the fence, but the rock for the innings was Leachy, coming in at 5/30 and getting us over the line. He was very scratchy early on but didn't give his wicket away and by the end he was seeing the ball like a beach ball, he ended up 37 not out off 95 balls.

We ended up passing them seven down with 32 overs to spare and not knowing that we had just won the grand final. It would've been nice to play in the grand final. I was very confident we would've won, we were the best side in the comp.

Next season I would expect to see Marty Nellen, Luke Tucker and Jarred Thompson playing higher. They all had good seasons and are good enough to go to the next level.... maybe a few more training sessions would help their case.
