1XI Report- James Court

After a successful 2017/2018 season we all had high hopes for what season 2018/2019 could bring. Unfortunately, after being so close to a grand final spot the previous season, the 2018/2019 season ended in relegation. We are not the first club to be relegated and we will not be the last. To stay in the top grade for 10 years was a great achievement which we should all be proud of.

Our fast bowling stocks took a hit over the previous off season. The unavailability of Blake Swanson and injuries to Marcus Adams and Josh Kazar plus a mid-season injury to Jesse Christensen really exposed our fast bowling depth. The loss of Blake in particular, who had bowled so well during the final month of the previous season was a big loss. As a result, opportunities were provided to club stalwarts Peter Eagles and Jason Butcher to resume their 1st X1 careers. These opportunities came off the back of consistent high-level performances in the 2nd x1. Peter Eagles opening the bowling for the whole season was probably not what he was expecting before the season started but he showed that he was still more than capable of mixing it with the best batsman in the competition.

Jordan Rutherford was our best bowler throughout the year and thoroughly deserved to win the 1st bowling average. Having an off-spin bowler in the side who is capable of holding down one end for at times almost the entire innings is a great luxury to have. As well as being extremely economical he also managed to make a lot of the better batsman in the competition look silly at times throughout the year. It is going to be exciting to see how he progresses over the next few years.

Our inability to convert starts into match winning innings with the bat cost us throughout the year. It is an area of our game that we need to get better at. We had six batsman make more than 250 runs for the season. However, at the same time we did not have 1 batsman make more than 400 runs. To win more games next season we realistically need at least 2 of our batsman making over 400 runs. To be competing for finals we need two batsman making over 500 runs.

No other club last season had six batsman make over 250 runs. We have the talent. We need to come up with better batting plans over the offseason and be disciplined enough to stick to the plans. If we can do this I am sure that we will start converting our 30s into match winning performances.

We had a lot of helpers throughout the year. Thank you to everyone who helped out in the kitchen and prepared the afternoon teas. Thanks to Doggy for always being there for us. Whether it is running out a drink, scoring or just being there to support us we know that he will always have our back. Thanks to Erin Parker for offering up her Saturday afternoons to come and score for us this year. We all really appreciate the time you gave up being there for us. Hopefully next season you can watch us win a few more games! Thanks also to Nags and Matty for teaching Erin how to score! Finally, a thank you to Mick Rutherford who was always willing to step in and score when Erin was unavailable.

Despite being relegated, we should all be looking forward to next season with a lot of optimism. I know I am. We have enough talent amongst us to get better results. We need to be smarter and learn from our mistakes. No more talking about what we need to do better. It is time to train smarter and put better plans in place. The return of some important senior players and the continued development of some young guns is something to be excited about and will add depth to the senior squad. 3XI Report- Ryan Toye

Season 2018/19 was always going to be a tough season for the 3s. There were a lot of players missing during the year from the club which meant we had 5 to 6 changes each week, and the inconsistency showed only winning 3 games for the season, but fortunately fighting our way out of relegation by half a game.

We had our chances early in the season, 2 good wins Round 3 and 4 and some tight losses leading into Christmas. If we won them, the boys would have had confidence and our season could've ended up a lot better than it was. But we didn't, and it was hard to keep the boys motivated after Christmas, and we dropped away and went through the motions for the second half of the season.

My goal at the start of the season was to hopefully play as many kids as possible and to give them important roles. Unfortunately, we didn't have many kids play this season, in fact, I probably had one of the oldest teams the 3s have had in years, with half the side over 35.

Some of the old boys had their best season in a long time though. Chris Robbins with 16 wickets, constantly took early wickets and broke partnerships when needed, Pete Colosimo with 15 wickets, 'Mr Reliable' always bowled to his field and never went for too many runs. With the bat Tim Court 240 runs, his role was a little different this season batting middle order but still did what Tim does best, bat long periods of time frustrating the bowling team.

Of the younger players who performed well during the season, Bailey Foran with 234 runs, this guy probably faced the most balls than anyone at the club this season. He never threw his wicket away, carried his bat in a game while pairing with Simon Varone for a 172-run partnership in a One dayer. Marty Nellen with 127 runs and 6 wickets, Marty is a dream to captain, can bat, bowl and field, he never argues, you say jump and he says how high, if he can get his body right, he can do anything.

It was good to see both Marty and Baily play 2s during the season. I expect to see both and then Hunter Bevis take the next step and play constant good cricket in the 2s next season. It was also great to see both the Robbos train, normally you only see them train at finals times. It's no coincidence that both found themselves in the 2s during the season.

The stand out batting performance for the season was between Marty and Hunters, who came together when we were in big trouble, chasing 148 in a One dayer. We were 6 for 44 in about the 12th over and not much to come after them. The boys got us across the line, with a 100 + run partnership for our first win of the season. The thing that stood out for me the most was how well they both turned the strike over, with one being right and the other left handed, the bowlers couldn't get in rhythm and the fielders got tired changing fielding positions most balls.

Other standouts; a 170-run partnership between Simon (109) and Bailey (53); Mick Robbins 87; Tim Court 61; Ryan Gilmore making 31 in his first game in the 3s and Hayden Richards 6fa on debut for the club.

Thank you to Glen Coyle for his Vice Captaincy during the year and captaining the team and to Tex Walker who also captained the side while I was away. To the other leaders in the team, Tim and Pete, thank you for helping me out during the season, it was much appreciated.

Next season could be make or break for the club. President Trump, The Executives and Burkey busted their bums off for us last season and they didn't receive much support in return from the current and ex-players. We need everyone to get behind them or there may not be a club in 5 to 10 years' time. I look forward to seeing everyone at preseason training.
