Seniors take on Dromana

On the weekend of the 11th September, we had our 4th annual practice game vs Dromana cricket club which is fast becoming a permanent fixture. It is a great opportunity for the coaching group to reward the guys who have really committed over pre season, as well as test a few players out to see what levels of improvement they have made.

A squad of 18 players were selected, which is always hard to manage, but to the boys credit, and to Marcus Adam's credit who was named captain, it was certainly a great success with all players getting a chance to either bowl or bat. A few players got the chance to bat twice or bowl for both teams due to Dromana having limited numbers.

The emphasis from the coaching group was on a few simple but important points:

- 1) Setting a standard now, that you hope to adhere to for the rest of the season
- 2) Putting yourself and your performance in the eyes of the selectors
- 3) Showing your improvement, and showing what you have learnt from pre season.

At the end of the day the result was not important, more the process of how the players went about things, how they reacted to certain situations, honing our skills in areas we know we need to improve and ensuring we started our season at what we now see as an acceptable level.

In terms of the group performance I was very happy that our level of skill seems to be getting better and better, and more importantly at the attitudes of the players. Despite Dromana's lack of quality, we demanded that we kept our standards high, and that as a group and individuals we applied ourselves to our level of intensity and skill, based on the challenges we set ourselves, rather than the challenges of the opposition.

Our batting was very controlled with a few individuals in particular starting their season off well. Adams, Devenish and Garoni were three who stood out, with contributions from Day and Tagger.

One of our main focuses was on not worrying about the scoreboard or the overs, meaning the score didn't count. I wanted controlled aggression from the batsmen, limiting chances of getting out, yet still pouncing on any balls we knew we could score off, and the whole top 8 did this to great effect.

Our bowling, was indifferent at times, but the way our bowlers bounced back after bowling a bad ball means any negatives are more a case of our bowlers getting used to performing the skill, rather than not being disciplined or good enough to execute it. Butcher impressed with the new ball showing great control, whilst our spinners Rutherford and Temple did exactly what we wanted and really gave the ball flight and a chance to spin. Joel Margenburg bowled for the opposition and I was very impressed with his ability to consistently hit an area, and not stray from the game plan.

Our fielding was as always, to the standard we expect, and this just highlights the need to do the amount of work we have done pre season. A few sharp catches were taken, a few direct hits were made, and our general intensity in the field was of a good level. The younger brigade of Beaton, Roughead and Day contributed greatly to the pressure that our bowlers were applying, whilst behind the stumps Varone and Smith kept the levels at a high standard.

As always, there is room for improvement, but building up towards round 1 I could not be happier with the guys. Congratulations to all for the way you handled yourselves on the weekend, and to a few individuals who ensured they gave themselves the best chance to perform and will make selection difficult.

That's the glory of sport and cricket in particular – everyone from 1 to 11 can score the winning run or take the winning catch or get the vital wicket – everyone gets a chance to stand up and deliver.

The theory is simple - the more effort you put in the better you get and the chance of you delivering increases.

Improvement comes from practice both in the techniques of the skills of the game and in the way you put those skills into effect. The coaching staff can help with the basic skills but how you use them in a game is a more personal matter and depends on how much you really want to succeed.

If you want to improve then my suggestion is that you should sit down either by yourself or with one of the coaches and identify your strengths and weaknesses. We all have plenty of both so we need to understand our strengths and use them as much as possible and at the same time work on eliminating our weaknesses.
